

ON GUARD AGAINST BREAST CANCER

The American Cancer Society says that regular mammograms for women over 40 are the most effective method of detecting breast cancer in its earliest stages, when it can be treated most effectively.* The vast majority of breast cancers are detected through mammography.

How often should women have breast exams?*

Women who do not have a family history of breast cancer or do not have any of the other risk factors should follow these guidelines: Women age 20 to 39 should have a clinical breast examination every three years and perform a monthly self-examination.

Women age 35 to 40 should have a baseline mammogram.

Women age 40 and older should have an annual mammogram, annual clinical breast examination and perform a monthly self-examination.

Any woman with a family history of breast cancer or any other risk factors should consult her physician regarding the frequency of examinations.


Bone Densitometry
